# **Art with Chrystal Phan Digital Field Trip Description**

Between 1979 and 1980, Canada brought 60,000 refugees to this country from Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia. Of the 7,361 refugees who came to BC, three-quarters were Vietnamese. Artist Chrystal Phan's family arrived on Canada's west coast in the fall of 1980. Join Chrystal for a virtual visit where we'll look at her family's story, examine some of her paintings and do a drawing activity together. Bring paper and pencil.

### **Program Format:**

- 1. Introduction to the program and Chrystal Phan
- 2. Painting Examination/Pair and Share
- 3. Drawing Activity each student needs a pencil and piece of paper
- 4. Q&A with the Artist
- 5. Wrap-up & Conclusion

## **Learning Objectives:**

- Experience how art offers a space to consider different cultures
- Appreciate some of the hardships of coming to Canada as a refugee
- Use sketching to closely observe and reflect on an object
